14(!) CONCORD STUDENTS EARN AP® SCHOLAR AWARDS!

LARGEST NUMBER OF CONCORD STUDENTS EVER NAMED IN ANNUAL HONORS

Fourteen students at Concord High School (usual enrollment: 100 students), have earned the designation of **AP Scholar** by the College Board in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college-level Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) Exams.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program offers students the opportunity to take challenging college-level courses while still in high school, and to receive college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. Only about 18 percent of the more than one-million high school students in almost 15,000 secondary schools worldwide who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to merit the recognition of AP Scholar.

Students took AP Exams in May 2005 after completing challenging college-level courses at their high schools. The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on student's performance on AP exams.

AP SCHOLARS WITH DISTINCTION

At Concord High School: Four students qualified for the **AP Scholar with Distinction** Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, *and* grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. These students are: **Alexandra Kelley Artz, Jason Randall Goetz, Taran Arthur Huffman** and **Petra Anais Szilagyi**.

AP SCHOLARS WITH HONOR

Four students qualified for the **AP Scholar with Honor** Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, *and* grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams. These students are: **Jamie Lynn Bence, Arista Sagar Chand, Anatole Leonard Paine** and **Dylan N. Wolman**. *Continued on back...*

ONLY THE BEGINNING...

Of this year's award recipients at Concord High School, Nine are juniors or seniors: **Jamie Lynn Bence, Lenore Cline Berry, Nicholas Michael Faguet, Jason Randall Goetz, Taran Arthur Huffman, Anatole Leonard Paine, Neil Frederik Richler, Nalina Eve Shivers,** and **Dylan N. Wolman**. These students have at least one more year in which to complete college-level work and possibly earn another AP Scholar Award before graduating from Concord.

Most of the nation's colleges and universities award credit, advanced placement, or both, based on successful performance on the **AP Exams**. More than 1,400 institutions award a full year's credit (sophomore standing) to students presenting a sufficient number of qualifying grades. In 2005, thirty-four AP Exams were offered in a wide variety of subject areas, each consisting of multiple-choice and free-response (essay or problem-solving) questions (except for the Studio Art exam which evaluates students' original artwork).
